Artists gather for Camps Bay couples' gallery opening

CAMPS Bay residents Brendon and Suzette Bell-Roberts have opened the Brendon Bell-Roberts Fine Art Gallery in Loop Street, with a group exhibition entitled *Itheko lokuza nethemba elithsha* (a celebration for new hope).

Brendon, a former fine arts stu-

dent, and Suzette, an attorney, launched their inaugural exhibition featuring works by locals including Tamboerskloof resident Louis Jansen van Vuuren, Nadja Daehnke of the City Bowl, Xolile Mtakatya of Khayelitsha as well as Brendhan Dickerson, Tyrone Appollis, Luke

Young, the Kwa Zulu Natal-based Ardmere Ceramic Art Studio and Brendon Bell-Roberts.

Situated in Graphics Centre, the gallery covers 350 sq m.

Bell-Roberts, who exhibits his own mixed media works in the new studio, says: "Our love of art and

culture has driven us to achieve our dream – to establish a gallery which is accessible to all and presents a credible forum for artists to exhibit. We will be holding monthly exhibitions by established and emerging South African artists. We have had extensive enquiries from artists, all

of whom welcome the arrival of a gallery space which is well-situated, world class and designed with the artist and his work in mind."
